LOCAL GOVERNMENT (WATER POLLUTION) ACTS 1977 AND 1990. APPLICATION FOR A LICENCE TO DISCHARGE EFFLUENT TO WATERS

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR COMPLETION OF APPLICATION.

GENERAL

Under the Local Government (Water Pollution) Acts 1977 and 1990, a licence is required for the discharge of any trade effluent to waters (other than domestic sewage not exceeding $5m^3$ in any period of 24 hours, which is discharged from a septic tank or other disposal unit by means of a percolation area, soakage pit or other method). The licensing system applies to both new and existing discharges.

WHERE TO APPLY

The application should be made to the County Council, in whose area the discharge occurs. In the case of discharges in County Limerick, the application should be made to the **Director of Environment & Emergency Services, Limerick County Council, County Hall, Dooradoyle, Co. Limerick.**

ADVERTISING AND APPLICATION FEE

Prior to the making of a licence application, the applicant shall publish in a newspaper circulating in the functional area of the local authority notice of his/her intention to make such an application. This notice shall contain as a heading the words "Discharge of Effluents to Waters" and shall

- (i) state the name of the applicant and the name of the local authority to which the application is being made,
- (ii) give a general description of the effluent,
- (iii) in the case of trade effluent, state the nature of the trade or industry,
- (iv) state the name and location of the premises from which the effluent is to be discharged, and
- (v) indicate the waters to which the effluent is to be discharged.

Please note that the application must be submitted to the County Council <u>within two weeks of</u> the publication of the notice in a newspaper.

The following items should be included when submitting the completed application form:

- (a) €380.00 application fee. The statutory two month period for consideration of your licence application does no commence until a full application, including fee, is received by Limerick County Council.
- (b) Copy of the full page of the newspaper in which your notice of intention to make the licence application was published.
- (c) The plans in duplicate, referred to in paragraph 4 of the application form.

In completing your application form you should refer to the Local Government (Water Pollution) Regulations, 1978 and 1992, copies of which are available from the Government Publications Office, Sun Alliance House, Molesworth St., Dublin 2.
